mitigation for mold from Service Master who placed fans in our home after the flood for over a month & then the process was started to mitigate which meant all the floors & walls on 1st floor were removed. After this ~~process~~ mitigation all first floor walls & floors had to be replaced & refinished. The cost of this was over \$70,000.00 Along with the house being damaged our yard had tons & tons of sand and big rocks up at our back door. Our rock retaining walls received damage - 1 wall 5ft x 20ft was completely washed away. Our yard & wall have still not been repaired completely. We received no monetary help from Fema. As we were told we had Flood insurance (As we have had for 40 years) This flood insurance was not National Flood it is Lloyds of London. It had a \$10,000 deductible. We were told on Saturday September 14<sup>th</sup> our house may float away from force of water and sand even after the rain had stopped. Because there are no walls on the creek downstream from our property the sand being carried past us spread out when it reached this flat area downstream & started to build up as there were no walls to keep it moving below us. The sand & water was at least 25 feet above the creek bed. The water continued to rise on our home until the city street crew drove ditch diggers (very large ditch diggers) into the raging water downstream from us. (Guthrie's property at #1 Scott was exact spot) They lifted sand upon to the bank allowing the water to finally flow down Cheyenne Creek. Within minutes the water receded from our property leaving much debris & tons of sand.

Question #3

Our opinion on what needs to be done would be:

Upstream from us at Seven Falls and Helen Hunt Falls Canyons there is no flood control.

At the meeting with you when this form was given out you stated there would be no looking into anything above the Starsmoor building. This area in the canyon is where the problem started. If the canyons did not exist we would never have had the flooding in September 2013 or the flooding in June 1965. Both of these floods destroyed the area of Seven Falls. What type of holding ponds are in this area that may impact the lower Cheyenne Canon. We feel it is very important that this area be looked into by you.

As stated in question #1 we also feel that walls that do not exist below us allowed the sand to build up and caused the major flooding of our home and property. As soon as the built up sand was removed by Co Springs street department the water immediately went down on our home. If these walls existed downstream the water and sand would have continued on to Fountain Creek.

The Fountain Creek Watershed Flood Control and Greenway District along with local partners has received funding from the Colorado Water Conservation Board to investigate restoration planning options for Upper Fountain Creek and Cheyenne Creek. Both creeks suffered from extensive flooding during the summer and fall of 2013. El Paso County, the City of Colorado Springs, the City of Manitou Springs and other regional municipalities and agencies have undertaken various projects to mitigate the risk and maintain the proper flow and water levels in Upper Fountain Creek, Cheyenne Creek and a number of tributaries. The 2013 floods resulted in the transport and deposition of considerable volumes of sediment and debris into the channels and along the floodplains of the creeks especially downstream of the Waldo Canyon Fire Burn Scar. This planning project has assessed existing conditions in Upper Fountain and Cheyenne Creeks and has evaluated the appropriate and necessary restoration measures and capital improvements to return the creeks to optimum conditions and mitigate further degradation and flood potential. We are here to update and inform the residents and local community about the progress that has been made and present the proposed plans and projects that are being evaluated for prioritization.
